If Mack is present, he is required to command the Army. <b>The Great Communicator;</b> Mack's rambling orders confuse subordinates, leaving them to guess his intentions. When activating an Objective, a Delay result activates the dummy Objective. When activating a Directive, a Delay result instead activates a random Directive; roll 1D6 and activate the corresponding Directive: A, D, M, S, R, W. <b>Predictable Court-Martial;</b> Mack is convicted of cowardice after surrendering the entire army at Ulm and imprisoned until 1808, after release he leads a quiet and uneventful life. Unavailable after 1805.
