Bennigsen can replace any Russian Army Commander but Barclay de Tolly or Kutusov, 1802-1815.

Flirts with Death; Berg is wounded multiple times during the Patriotic War and the War of Liberation, once at Polotsk in 1812 and then again at Reichenbach in 1813; -1 in Leader Fate, but +2 if Harmed, 1812-1813.

An Unfortunate Death ; Lavrov falls ill during the opening of the 1813 campaign and dies in September. Unavailable after June 1813.
